### Principles of Presbyterian Government (Part 1)

The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) reaffirms, within the context of its commitment to the Church universal, a special commitment to basic principles of Presbyterian polity:

### One Church

The particular congregations of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) wherever they are, taken collectively, constitute one church, called the church.

### Governed by Presbyters

This church shall be governed by presbyters, that is, ruling elders and teaching elders (also called ministers of the Word and Sacrament). Ruling elders are so named not because they "lord it over" the congregation (Matt. 20:25), but because they are chosen by the congregation to discern and guide in its fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life. Ministers of the Word and Sacrament shall be committed in all their work to teaching the faith in word and in deed and equipping the people of God for their ministry and witness.

### **Gathered** in Councils

These presbyters shall come together in councils in regular gradation. These councils are sessions, presbyteries, synods, and the General Assembly. All councils of the church are united by the nature of the church and share with one another responsibilities, rights, and powers as provided in this Constitution. The councils are distinct, but have such mutual relations that the act of one of them is the act of the whole church performed by it through the appropriate council. The larger part of the church, or a representation thereof, shall govern the smaller.

### Seek and Represent the Will of Christ

Presbyters are not simply to reflect the will of the people, but rather to seek together to find and represent the will of Christ.

# **Finance**

A few words from your Finance Committee – Preparing for 2024 is underway!

October is the month when our members and friends are asked to consider their financial commitment for the next year and to return their pledge card <u>no later</u> than the last Sunday in October. Pledged income comprises about 86% of the sources of revenue supporting the Church's General Operating Budget, so knowing this number is vitally important in developing it!

Your commitment to financially support your church in 2024 is critical, as your Session begins developing the spending plan for the next year. Our current annual operations budget is approximately \$340,000. 67% of that goes to support the dedicated people who have been chosen to direct and assist us, and most of the remainder (20%) goes to keeping our church building open and functioning. The remaining 13% – in addition to the donations to the many projects spearheaded by our Board of Deacons – goes to help those in need in our community and elsewhere. Our 68 pledges for this year provided us with \$294,000, or 86% of the income supporting this budget. Looking forward, inflationary pressures will increase the amount of funds needed to just continue what we are currently doing. And there is no doubt that we could do more!

It is our life in and our commitment to our church which will be of immense help in following the two commandments which guide our life – LOVE GOD WITH ALL YOUR HEART and LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF!

We will be discussing the specifics of church finances and the importance of your commitment at the Wednesday night dinner on October 11, and all are welcome. If anyone has questions about the importance of your financial commitment, please contact me, any member of the Session or Pastor Bill Pinches.

Please prayerfully consider your financial commitment for the next year and return your pledge card as soon as possible, but no later than Sunday, October 29. If you have not received a pledge card by October 10, please contact the church. Extra cards will be available outside the office.

### Youth Sunday School

Sunday school for youth of all ages will be held during the worship service from 10:20am-11:00am. Youth are dismissed from the sanctuary after the Lord's Prayer. They enjoy a light snack together in the education room and then start Sunday school according to their age group:

<u>Pre-K through 5<sup>th</sup> grade</u> - Following their third-year rotational curriculum, we will be using Cokebury's, "Celebrate Wonder-all ages."
