For Your Study and Reflection This Week Fourth Sunday in Lent

Numbers 21:4-9

The people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned by speaking against the LORD and against you; pray to the LORD to take away the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people. And the LORD said to Moses, "Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole, and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live." So Moses made a serpent of bronze and put it upon a pole, and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live. (vv. 7-9)

Psalm 107:1-3, 17-22

O give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever. (v. 1)

Ephesians 2:1-10

For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God. (v. 8)

John 3:14-21

For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. (v. 16)

Question for Reflection

What does the light of God's truth reveal about your life? Are there parts of your life that you want to hide from God? Can you imagine what it would be like to live completely transparent to God's piercing light?

Loving God, draw me to your light, that I may avoid the dangers of sin and receive the freedom of your grace in Jesus Christ. Amen.
