### Christian Worship: An Introduction (continued)

### The Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is "the giver and renewer of life" (A Brief Statement of Faith), who instills our faith and enables us to follow Jesus Christ. The Scriptures describe how the Spirit moved at the dawn of creation, anointed Christ in baptism, raised Jesus from the dead, and was poured out on the Church at Pentecost. The same Spirit is still at work in the life of the Church and the life of the world.

The Holy Spirit manifests God's gracious action and empowers our grateful response. The Spirit gathers us for worship, enlightens and equips us through the Word, claims and nourishes us through the Sacraments, and sends us out for service. To each member of Christ's body, the Spirit gives gifts for ministry in the Church and mission in the world.

#### **Word and Sacrament**

In Christian worship Jesus Christ is truly present and active among us, by the power of the Holy Spirit, through the gifts of Word and Sacrament. Wherever the Scriptures are read and proclaimed and the Sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper are celebrated, the Church bears witness to Jesus Christ, the living Word, and proclaims the mystery of faith. Through these means of grace, God imparts and sustains our faith, orders our common life, and transforms the world. Through these same acts of worship, we share in the life of the Spirit, are united to Jesus Christ, and give glory to God.

### Worship and the Church

God's gifts of Word and Sacrament establish and equip the Church as the body of Christ in the world. The mission of the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church flows from Baptism, is nourished at Lord's Supper, and serves to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ to all. In the same way, the Church's ministry emerges from the font, arises from the table, and takes its shape from the Word of the Lord. Therefore the worship of the triune God is the center of our common life and our primary way of witness to the faith, hope, and love we have in Jesus Christ.

To be a Christian is to worship Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord. To be a member of Christ's body, the Church, is to share through Word and Sacrament in the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit.

# Session Synopsis

The Session made further appointments to committees for 2024. The 2024 Scholarship Commission will include Ginnie Gibson representing the Finance Committee, Sharon Ambrose and Suzanne Lang as congregation representatives, and Donna Hujsak and Sandy Leutscher representing the Board of Deacons with Spiritual Growth Director Lori Filka as an ex-officio member. The Memorial Committee of Mary Schrock (Class of 2024), Linda Peterson (Class of 2025), and Suzie Threadgould (Class of 2026), will also include Deb Johnson (Class of 2027) and Vern Schrock as Finance Committee representatives with Pastor Bill as an ex-officio member.

At the last General Assembly of the PCUSA, racial injustice was a priority concern amidst national and global unrest. Following an apology for such injustice, all congregations are required to develop an antiracism policy. Session authorized what is now known as the Bridge Builders for Racial Atonement Task Force being led by Elder Monte Shuck to develop such policy and to also identify programs that support racial atonement and education on racial issues. Congregational input and feedback are encouraged.

The Finance Committee reviewed and submitted revisions that Session approved to the Fundraising Guidelines. The Guidelines outline the process for Session approval of groups, projects, and programs before they may make presentations requesting funds from the congregation. The Guidelines now include a comprehensive list of mission projects, special offerings, programs, and organizations approved to solicit funds within the church.

The Parish Life Committee will be assisting with the Spiritual Growth Family Game Night, now rescheduled for March 9<sup>th</sup>.

The Personnel Committee reported a very favorable annual review of Music Director Deb Melse.

The Spiritual Growth Committee is seeking new dates for the summer Vacation Bible School. The current schedule of July 9-11 conflicts with Adventure Week at Camp Greenwood. The high school youth are seeking more ways to serve including consideration of assisting in the MSU Suicide Watch project. At least four youth are planning to attend the National Youth Conference at Montreat, North Carolina this summer.

The Administration Committee is pursuing bids to repair the Sanctuary ceiling before excessive sagging and ceiling tile failure occur. There is also needed repair of old water damaged surfaces in the southeast corner. Repairs are pending to the outdoor main heating unit that heats the education wing. The repair of the office heating units will require total unit replacement as component parts and controls are not available for the foreign manufactured office unit. Session approved \$6,000 from Contingency Reserve Funds for the office HVAC replacement unit.

The Worship & Music Committee updated instructions for Communion servers. The task list for the Christmas Eve service is under review.

The Mission Committee made available a notice for a panel discussion by the Justice League on the evening of February 28<sup>th</sup> at the East Lansing Public Library.

A progress report was received on the preparation of name tags for church members. The growing presence of new friends and visitors has resulted in the need and a request for name tags that were once worn in the past. The Security Team members are already wearing orange name tags while on duty.

### Bridge Builders for Racial Atonement Task Force

The Task Force was formed to address the issue of racial inequality within our church, our community, and beyond. We have begun our work on several fronts:

- \* As mandated by the Presbyterian Church (USA), we have developed an Antiracism statement, which will be available for your review and comment, and, once completed, will be adopted by Session.
- \* Performing research on the racial makeup and history of our community.
- \* Begun development of racial issue education for our congregation.
- \* Requested purchase of several books on race and racial issues for the Church library.

We acknowledge that race, discrimination, racism, and white supremacy are not comfortable terms and do not make for easy conversations. But, as proclaimed in the PC(USA) Antiracism statement (and included in ours, as well):

Because of our biblical understanding of who God is and what God intends for humanity, we must stand against, speak against, and work against racism. Antiracist effort is not optional for Christians, it is an essential aspect of Christian discipleship, without which we fail to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ."
