For Your Study and Reflection This Week **4th Sunday after Pentecost**

Ezekiel 17:22-24

All the trees of the field shall know
that I am the Lord.
I bring low the high tree;
I make high the low tree;
I dry up the green tree
and make the dry tree flourish.
I the LORD have spoken;
I will accomplish it. (v. 24)

Psalm 92:1-4, 12-15

The righteous flourish like the palm tree
and grow like a cedar in Lebanon. (v. 12)

2 Corinthians 5:6-10 (11-13), 14-17

So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old
has passed away; look, new things have come into being! (v. 17)

Mark 4:26-34

With many such parables he spoke the word to them as they were
able to hear it; he did not speak to them except in parables, but he
explained everything in private to his disciples. (vv. 33-34)

Question for Reflection

The passage from 2 Corinthians urges us to be reconciled, to engage in the ministry of reconciliation, and to be ambassadors for Christ. How can you join in a ministry of reconciliation as an ambassador of Christ?

Household Prayer: Morning
