Job 38:1-11

Then the LORD answered Job out of the whirlwind:
“Who is this that darkens counsel
by words without knowledge?” (vv. 1-2)

Psalm 107:1-3, 23-32

Then they cried to the LORD in their trouble,
and he brought them out from their distress;
he made the storm be still,
and the waves of the sea were hushed.

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Let them thank the LORD for his steadfast love,
for his wonderful works to humankind. (vv. 28-29, 31)

2 Corinthians 6:1-13

We are putting no obstacle in anyone’s way, so that no fault may
be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we have
commended ourselves in every way: in great endurance,
afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, riots,
labors, sleepless nights, hunger; in purity, knowledge, patience,
kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love, truthful speech, and the
power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right
hand and for the left; in honor and dishonor, in ill repute and
good repute. We are treated as impostors and yet are true.
(vv. 3-8)

Mark 4:35-41

He said to them, “Why are you afraid? Have you still no
