

Question for Reflection

James and John, elsewhere called “Sons of Thunder” (see Mark 3:17), ask to sit at Jesus’ side and share in his glory (Mark 10:35-37). Jesus, in turn, asks whether they are able to drink his cup or be baptized with his baptism (Mark 10:38). Isaiah’s song of the Suffering Servant has similar themes: “Therefore I will allot him a portion with the great . . . because he poured out himself to death” (Isa. 53:12). What does it mean to share in Christ’s glory? What does it mean to share in his cup or his baptism?

Isaiah 53:4-12

But he was wounded for our transgressions,
crushed for our iniquities;
upon him was the punishment that made us whole,
and by his bruises we are healed. (v. 5)

Psalms 91:9-16

Those who love me, I will deliver;
I will protect those who know my name.
When they call to me, I will answer them;
I will be with them in trouble;
I will rescue them and honor them. (v. 14-15)

Hebrews 5:1-10

Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered, and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him. (vv. 8-9)

Mark 10:35-45

“But it is not so among you; instead, whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve and to give his life a ransom for many.”
(vv. 43-45)
